Hindu's believe in reincarnation. Their beliefs include: everything alive has an Atman, the Atman is what we truly are, not the body, the Atman is eternal, when someone dies the Atman leaves the body and after a while the Atman returns in a newly born body.

Hindu's believe reincarnation happens many times, and will only stop when the Atman has reach perfection and is then able to leave this world forever and become reunited with Brahman (one Supreme God).

Moksha is when the Atman achieves perfection and escapes reincarnation.
